

The UAW Retiree Medical Benefits Trust (the “Trust”) is making potentially impacted members aware of an event experienced by our benefits administration provider, NationsBenefits Holdings, LLC (“NationsBenefits”).

On February 7, 2023, NationsBenefits learned that its vendor – Fortra, LLC (“Fortra”) – suffered a data security incident which resulted in access to or the acquisition of data belonging to NationsBenefits. NationsBenefits analyzed the impacted data and determined personal information belonging to some of the Trust members was impacted by this incident. NationsBenefits diligently worked with the Trust to identify up-to-date address information to notify impacted individuals. On April 13, 2023, NationsBenefits started providing notice of this incident to potentially impacted individuals. The notice includes information about the incident and about the steps that potentially impacted individuals can take to protect their information.

NationsBenefits is providing notice to impacted Trust members by mail and including an offer for free credit monitoring together with identity theft assistance and insurance. NationsBenefits is also notifying the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services’ Office for Civil Rights and relevant state authorities. The Trust encourages potentially impacted individuals to remain vigilant against incidents of identity theft and fraud, to review account statements, and to monitor their credit reports and explanation of benefits forms for suspicious activity.
